keynote speakers



Dave Grossman
Lt. Colonel, U.S. Army (ret.)

In their description of Lt. Col. Dave Grossman, *Slate Magazine* said, "Grossman cuts such a heroic, omniscient figure, he could have stepped out of a video game." He has five patents to his name, has published four novels, two children's books, and six non-fiction books to include his "perennial bestseller" *On Killing* (with over half a million copies sold), and a *New York Times* best-selling book co-authored with Glenn Beck. He is a US Army Ranger, a paratrooper, and a former West Point Psychology Professor. He has a Black Belt in Hojutsu, the martial art of the firearm, and has been inducted into the USA Martial Arts Hall of Fame.

Col. Grossman's research was cited by the President of the United States in a national address, and he has testified before the U.S. Senate, the U.S. Congress, and numerous state legislatures. He has served as an expert witness and consultant in state and Federal courts. He helped train mental health professionals after the Jonesboro school massacre, and he was also involved in counseling or court cases in the aftermath of the Paducah, Springfield, Littleton and Nickel Mines Amish school massacres.

Col. Grossman has been called upon to write the entry on "Aggression and Violence" in the Oxford Companion to American Military History, three entries in the Academic Press Encyclopedia of Violence, Peace and Conflict and has presented papers before the national conventions of the American Medical Association, the American Psychiatric Association, the American Psychological Association, and the American Academy of Pediatrics.

Today Col. Grossman is the director of the Killology Research Group (www.killology.com). In the wake of the 9/11 terrorist attacks he has written and spoken extensively on the terrorist threat, with articles published in the Harvard Journal of Law and Civil Policy and many leading law enforcement journals, and he has been inducted as a "Life Diplomate" by the American Board for Certification in Homeland Security, and a "Life Member" of the American College of Forensic Examiners Institute.

Dr. Bob Wertkin, Western Michigan University

Dr. Robert Wertkin is a professor in the School of Social Work at Western Michigan University. His doctorate is from the University of Utah and MSW from the University of Kansas. He is the recipient of the WMU Distinguished Service award and the University of Utah Faculty Award for Outstanding Scholarship and Promise.

Professor Wertkin is the founding chair of the WMU Millennial Project. This was a five-year university-wide effort to increase understanding of how patterns of learning change with each generation and to explore strategies to adjust and adapt teaching methods accordingly. The project emphasized each generation's strengths and identified strategies for obtaining more cohesive working relationships and reducing intergenerational conflict. He has made numerous presentations on multiple generations in the work place at the local, national, and international level. Audiences have included universities, businesses and corporations, hospitals, social service and mental health agencies, realtors, and labor unions.
